We hope everyone has a happy and safe Halloween.



Reminders:

Car Parking, Drop-offs and Pick-ups:

- You should **not get out of your car** in the Drop-Off/Pick up Zone.
- If you need to accompany your child to the school or if they need extra time getting out of the car, please park in the Community Centre across the road and cross the road at the new pedestrian crossing (lights due to turned on soon). There are two disabled spaces outside the school if needed.
- Please keep the **bus lane clear** until it arrives.
- The school car park is a **one-way system** please do not block the entrance.
- Please only let your children out of the car in the Drop off/Pick up zone outside the pedestrian
 gates (do not let your children out of the car halfway through the car park or in any area where
 there is no path).
- There should be no need for the driver to get out of the car.
- Please ensure that the children have their **coats on and their bags ready** before you arrive at the school.
- Children should, where possible, **exit the car on the left hand side**, to avoid anyone walking behind/around a car.
- Please park in the <u>Community Centre</u> car park as much as possible.
- When exiting the school car park PLEASE TURN LEFT.
- Please note that children will be supervised from 9 am until 3.10pm each school day. (Please avoid dropping your child to school before 9 am)
- Please share this information with whoever is responsible for dropping your children to school in the morning and collecting after school grandparents, minders, car poolers etc.

<u>School Uniforms:</u> Jnr & Snr Infants: P.E. Gear can be worn every day. Or full uniform can be worn if you wish and PE gear for PE days. **1st – 6th:** Full uniform must be worn every day. P.E. gear is worn on P.E. days & swimming days. (Navy shorts can be worn every day during nice weather) Dark runners or shoes should be worn every day.

<u>Bobble Hats:</u> School branded bobble hats (€10) and shorts (€15) are available from the school office.

Curriculum Links

<u>Music:</u> Ukulele lessons with Harry Long have re-commenced this term, with our first class children taking up the instrument for the first time. We look forward to showcasing the progress at a later date. Thanks to the Parents Association who purchased 30 new ukuleles over the summer.

<u>School Self Evaluation</u>; Our SSE going forward will be in the curriculum area of Maths. We have recently purchased new maths equipment and would like to thank the Parents Association for their generous funding in this regard. Our main focus will be on developing mental arithmetic and problem solving skills. We plan to circulate a survey to all parents upon our return to school in November.

<u>Creative Clusters:</u> We will be taking part in the Creative Clusters initiative again this year. Creative Clusters is a Creative Youth and Department of Education initiative led by Education Support Centres Ireland under the Schools Excellence Fund. We will be working alongside Stackallen NS and Slane NS on a creative project to be decided.

<u>Art Project</u>; The school is working with local artist Betty Newman-Maguire to design a piece of sculpture for the school sensory garden. Each class has been given a specific garden lifeform upon which to focus and students will develop their own artwork through drawing, painting, sculpture and poetry. We hope to complete the project in the early months of the New Year.

<u>Drama Club:</u> Following the huge success of "Oliver! Jnr", we are delighted to announce that the school will be launching a drama club with Ms. Martyn and Sharon Carroll. This will commence on the week of our return after the mid-term break. More details to follow.

Buddy System; September saw the return of our buddy system when our 5th class and 6th class students link up with children from the infant classes for activities such as buddy reading and other fun activities.

<u>Nature Walk</u>; In early October, the infant classes went on an nature walk along the Greenway. The children really enjoyed trying to spot all the different signs of autumn.

<u>Science Week</u> will take place from 12th-19th November. All students will be participating in fun science activities throughout the week. For example, Mr. Byrne's 3rd Class will be visiting Navan Library for "Dr. Brian's Funbelievable Science Show" on 15th November.

"Roots of Empathy" Programme; Our 5th Class are currently participating in an evidence based programme called "Roots of Empathy" which is being overseen by Grainne Carroll. This course is aimed at reducing aggression, increasing caring, sharing and inclusion and promoting resilience, well-being and positive mental health. The programme will run for a total of 27 weeks. Last week we enjoyed a visit from baby Lily and her mother Aoife. We look forward to following her development over the coming months as part of this programme.
